Ostrander Awards include lighting design for THOROUGHLY MODERN MILLIE, the Behind the Scenes Award for the 2006-2007 season, and the 2021 Janie McCrary Putting it Together Award.

Amie Eoff (Resident Costume Designer) is pleased to be the Resident Costume Designer at TM. From 2012-2014, she served as the Costume Shop Supervisor at Rhodes College, and in 2012, she completed her fourth season as the Resident Costume Designer for Circuit Playhouse. He has won Ostrander Awards for Best Musical Direction (NINE, University of Memphis), Best Sound Design (URINETOWN THE MUSICAL, Theatre Memphis), and the Larry Riley Rising Star award.

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
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
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
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
