



THANK YOU for embracing the first two shows of the season with your enthusiastic attendance of Something Rotten! as well as Shakespeare's masterpiece Hamlet which sold-out every performance in our Next Stage including an added performance.

As Randall Hartzog wrote, "There have been many angels among us at Theatre Memphis, and in August our *most* angelic got his wings. **Gene Cochran**, former Theatre Memphis Board President and TM's most ardent supporter, passed away after a lengthy illness. Even though Gene avoided it, he deserves the brightest spotlight and a continued standing ovation.

Once again, we are so proud of our Theatre Memphis talented family of designers, directors and actors who were recognized for their outstanding work at the 2025 Memphis Ostrander Theatre Awards in August. We are most grateful that the Ostranders' recognized Theatre Memphis with 22 out of 32 awards including Best Musical – Disney's BEAUTY AND THE BEAST garnering 7 awards, Best Play – SILENT SKY and Best Ensemble – AIN'T MISBEHAVIN'. All of our amazing TM production designers under the leadership of Production Manager Michael Compton were awarded Best of Show in their categories which included Jack Netzel-Yates, resident scenic and prop designer; Amie Eoff, resident costume designer and Ashley Selberg, costume shop supervisor; Nicole Northington, resident lighting designer and Emily Luce, resident sound designer. A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

From the moment I read The Musical Comedy Murders of 1940, I knew I wanted to stage it as a love letter to the theatre — in all its chaos, glamour, and absurdity. This show is many things: a murder mystery, a backstage comedy, a farce. But what drew me to it was how completely it embraces the idea that everyone, in one way or another, is performing. In shaping this production, I was inspired by the physical comedy and stylized mayhem of Young Frankenstein, the faded theatrical ego of Sunset Boulevard, and the colorful, clue-by-clue unraveling of Clue: The Musical. I wanted to create a world that feels just a little too dramatic, a little too glamorous, and a lot too ridiculous — where lightning flashes on cue, revolving bookshelves hide secrets, and every character believes the spotlight still belongs to them. Working with this cast and creative team has been a true joy. They dove headfirst into the timing, the slapstick, the high-stakes silliness — and brought heart, discipline, and a sense of play that makes the chaos sing. I hope that you, like us, get swept up in the energy, the mystery, and the theatrical absurdity of it all.
